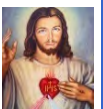

PLENARY COUNCIL Q & A - A Few Answers From Other Parishes:

- ☆ We need to evangelise more to the people whom don't know about God, to let them know that He loves them and encourage them to want to know Him.
- ☆ How can we help families and those struggling with mental illness – we need to reach out more to people in crisis.

- ☆ We need to understand REPENTANCE in a simpler, more pure way – a call to recognise mistaken beliefs and judgments that prevent healing and unity.
- ☆ TRAINING OF PRIESTS – take a careful look at the training of priests in the seminaries to eliminate anyone who is not suitable.
- ☆ The Church needs to be more outspoken on Social Justice issues, consider allowing married priests and more support for priests, especially in isolated parishes.
- ☆ To contribute to the evangelisation of the Gospel and to share my faith openly with others.
- ☆ We need to make people feel welcome at church, it is happening more now than earlier, and to have bible studies and meditations more available.
- ☆ We need to focus on forgiveness, repentance, listening, prayer and truth.
- ☆ We need to genuinely look out for new comers to church and make them feel welcome and then to take this attitude towards others outside our church.
- ☆ God is asking of us: For us to be forgiving and accepting to others, as we have our full faith within the Lord. Like with family, friends, and those who are strangers to us, since God wanted us all to be on unity and to have respect to all.
- ☆ New challenges, not the same as 1930s (Last Plenary council). Change is needed:
 - ◆ Euthanasia
 - ◆ Abortion
 - ◆ Legalisation of gay marriage
- ☆ The Lord is asking us in Australia a need of letting out our way of spreading our faith and our voice.



JOB WELL DONE TO ALL...

The Saint Vincent de Paul Hilton Conference and the fortunate people who received a hamper this year, would like to thank the teachers and students from Seton College and OLMC Primary School who supplied the magnificent hampers, and to the parishioners and friends who helped our members deliver them. Many touching stories have been passed back from the different groups delivering the hampers which included gratitude, tears, and their stories of hardship. Our Conference visited more than two hundred households over the last six months, all of which were all included on this years hamper list. The generous number of large hampers received from both schools tallied 56 and were supported by another 28 smaller hampers put together by our group, totalling 84 all up. The groups delivering hampers this year were given the names of twice the number of families than hampers, and had to choose which families received them. In truth, this imbalance catered for the transient nature of people today, for many families had moved on and the houses were either empty or had new occupants. One group delivering



hampers actually ran out of names with a hamper remaining - it didn't go to waste. In the end, our limited resources are never going to cater for 100% of the needy families in the area, but by achieving 40% this year must be seen as a success. POPE FRANCIS: AN INVITATION TO JOY ON BAMBELLI SUNDAY. **Angelus: 16 December 2018, St Peter's Square, Vatican City.** The Third Sunday of Advent has for many years been the day

when the children of Rome bring the Baby Jesus statues from their Nativity Scenes to St Peter's Square to be blessed by the Pope during the Angelus. The day is affectionately known as "Bambinelli Sunday." The theme chosen by the Roman Oratory Centre for this traditional appointment with Pope Francis on Sunday was "All the joy in a manger". Speaking from the window of his studio in the Apostolic Palace, the Pope told the children wrapped up against the winter chill, that "when you gather in your homes in prayer before the manger, looking at the Child Jesus, you will feel amazement at the great mystery of God made man; and the Holy Spirit will give your heart the humility, tenderness and goodness of Jesus. This is the true Christmas! May this be so for you and for your families." Before the recitation of the Marian Prayer, Pope Francis said the liturgy on this third Sunday of Advent invites us to be joyful. The inhabitants of Jerusalem are called to rejoice because the Lord has lifted his condemnation. The Pope continued, "consequently, there is no longer any reason for sadness or discouragement for the people, but everything leads to joyful gratitude to God, who always wants to redeem and save those he loves." Delving into the readings of the day, the Pope noted that the appeal of the prophet Zephaniah who says, 'He will rejoice for you, he will renew you with his love, he will exult for you with cries

of joy', "is particularly appropriate at this time as we prepare for Christmas", because, the Pontiff added, "it applies to Jesus, the Emmanuel, the God who is with us: his presence is the source of joy." Saint Paul, Pope Francis commented, "also exhorts us today not to be anxious for anything, but in every circumstance to present to God our requests, our needs, our concerns with prayers and supplications. The awareness that in difficulties we can always turn to the Lord, and that He never rejects our invocations, is a great reason for joy", the Pope said. "No worry, no fear will ever be able to take away from us the serenity that comes from knowing that God guides our lives lovingly, always. Even in the midst of problems and suffering, this certainty nourishes hope and courage." Pope Francis stressed this season of Advent is one of conversion, and in order to accept the Lord's invitation to joy, he said, we need to be asking ourselves at this time "what should I do". Following the Angelus, the Pope recalled the adoption of the Global Compact for Safe, Ordered and Regular Migration which took place in Marrakech, Morocco, during the week. Pope Francis expressed the hope that this instrument, "will be able to work with responsibility, solidarity and



compassion towards those who, for various reasons, have left their country..."
