GRIEF TO GRACE PROGRAM - Spiritual and Psychological Healing from Abuse:

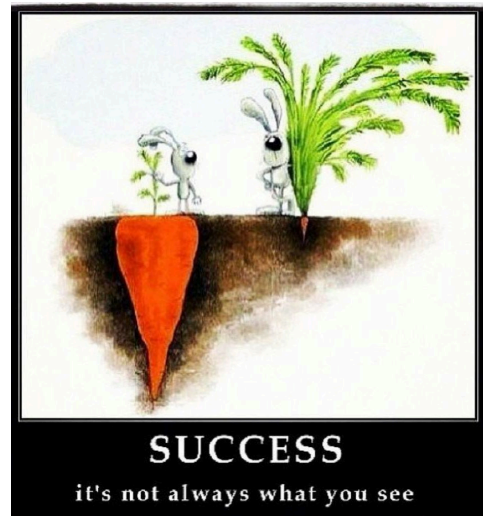
Since 2005, the international program *Grief to Grace* has been assisting people wounded by abuse - whether clergy, spiritual, sexual, physical, domestic, spousal, or emotional abuse - to restore their dignity and their relationship with a loving God. *Grief to Grace* uses a trauma-informed somatic and sensory healing model, delivered by a professional and trained team as a five-day residential structured retreat. It has a Judeo-Christian framework with Scripture meditations, group work, and individual exercises. By travelling the Paschal mystery of their own suffering, participants can join with Christ in His Resurrection. Everyone is welcome to approach the program, regardless of faith profession, current relationship with the Church, sexual orientation, or abuse history. We welcome men, women, priests, religious and seminarians who have been wounded by abuse. All inquiries are treated as confidential. Our ministry has no formal or financial link with any diocese. *Grief to Grace* will be available in **July 2019** in Perth, Western Australia. **Dates:** Sunday 14 July - Friday 19 July 2019. **Venue:** Safety Bay (near Perth), Western Australia. is the response of faith”, Pope Francis said, the response “that that we too are called to give; and the attitude of openness that the Lord asks of all His disciples, especially insofar as they have duties of responsibility in the Church”. It is Simon’s “trusting obedience” that prompts the miraculous catch of fish. The Pope explained, “When we come with generosity to His service, [Jesus] accomplishes great things in us”. This, the Pope said, is how Jesus deals with each of us: “He asks us to welcome Him into the boat of our life, to begin again with Him and set out on a new sea, that turns out to be full of surprises”. Jesus’ invitation, he said, “gives new meaning to our existence”. If we, like Peter, are sometimes surprised or hesitant at this call, Jesus encourages us. If we trust in Him, the Pope said, God will free us from our sin, “and open us up to new horizons, to collaborate in his mission.” “The greatest miracle accomplished by Jesus for Simon and the other disappointed and tired fishermen, is not so much the nets filled with fish, but to have helped them to not fall victim to disappointment and discouragement in the face of setbacks”, Pope Francis said. “He opened the way for them to become heralds and witnesses of His word and of the Kingdom of God.”






POPE FRANCIS: WHEN WE ARE GENEROUS, GOD ACCOMPLISHES GREAT THINGS IN US. Angelus - 10 February 2019, St Peter’s Square, Vatican City.



Sunday’s Gospel, Pope Francis said in remarks at the weekly Angelus, “concerns a miraculous sign” — the prodigious catch of fish — “a sign of the power of the word of Jesus.” When we respond generously to God’s call, he said, Jesus “accomplishes great things in us.” The Holy Father was reflecting on the days Gospel, which tells how Jesus “surprised” Simon by climbing in his boat, and going out a little ways from the shore to teach the people. Then, the Pope said, Jesus made another “surprising ‘move’” by asking Simon to “put out into the deep” and lower his nets for a catch. Simon (to whom Jesus would later give the name Peter) seems at first to offer an objection; but, the Pope said, “inspired by the presence of Jesus, and illuminated by His word,” Simon does as he is asked. “It
