**THE CARMELITE SPIRIT – St Teresa of Avila:** "This is the method of prayer I then used: Since I could not reflect discursively with



the intellect, I strove to picture Christ within me, and it did me great good—in my opinion—to picture Him in those scenes where I saw Him more alone... The scene of his prayer in the garden, especially, was a comfort to me; I strove to be his companion there. If I could, I thought of the sweat and agony He had undergone in that place. I desired to wipe away the sweat He so painfully experienced, but I recall that I never dared to actually do it, since my sins appeared to me so serious. I remained with Him as long as my thoughts allowed me to, for there were many distractions that tormented me. Most nights for many years before going to bed, when I commended myself to God in preparation for sleep, I always pondered for a little while this episode of prayer in the garden."



**THE CROSS by ALAN AMES:**

Just as the cross could not overcome or defeat Our Lord, Jesus, we should not let our crosses overcome us. If we, in the hard times, keep focused on The Lord in His suffering our suffering will come into perspective and not imprison us in thoughts of self-pity or despair. As we look to how He suffered and died for us without complaining we can find hope as we let go of the thoughts that lead us into despair and let His divine grace from the cross fill us and lead us beyond any fear of what might lay ahead as we find security in Him for the life to come. It is also in offering our pain to Him on the cross and allowing Him to unite it in His sacrifice of love that our suffering becomes a sacrifice for others, a sacrifice that by His grace can bring salvation and healing to those in need. Then we can also find the grace not to complain about our suffering and making it a burden for others but instead let people see the joy of being united with The Lord in His suffering a joy that can bring many to desire that joy too if and when they may suffer. In this Holy Week let us reach out to our crucified Lord in the hope that we can embrace Him on the cross not turn away



from Him and in that embrace find holiness in any suffering we may have through Him. God bless...

**POPE FRANCIS: EVERY TRUE CONVERSION IS DIRECTED TO A NEW FUTURE.** Homily on 07 April 2019, St Peter's Square, Vatican City.




The Gospel of the day presents us with two conflicting attitudes, the Pope said: the attitude "of the scribes and Pharisees, on the one hand; and that of Jesus on the other". The former, he explained wanted to condemn the woman caught in adultery, precisely because "they considered themselves the guardians of the law and of its faithful application". Jesus, however, desired to save her, "because He incarnates the mercy of God who redeems by forgiving and renews by reconciling". Pope Francis said the Gospel makes it clear that the scribes and Pharisees had brought the woman to Jesus precisely in order to test him, and find something with which they could accuse Him. If Jesus said the woman should not be stoned, they could accuse Him of "disobedience" to the Law; but if He said she should be stoned, they could denounce Him to the Romans, who did not allow the Jews to exercise the death penalty. "Jesus' interlocutors were closed in by the narrowness of legalism", the Pope said, "and they wanted to enclose the Son of God in their own perspective and condemnation". Jesus, though, came into the world "not to judge and condemn, but to save, and to offer people a new life". When Jesus said, "Let the one among you who is without sin, cast the first stone," He was appealing to the consciences of the men, reminding them that they, too, were sinful. "This scene invites each one of us, too, to realise that we are sinners," the Pope said, and calls us "to let fall from our hands the stones of denigration and condemnation, of gossiping that at times we would hurl against others". When we cast these stones at others, he said, we become like the scribes and Pharisees in the Gospel.

Quoting St Augustine, Pope Francis said that after all her accusers left, only the woman and Jesus remain, "the miserable one, and Mercy". Jesus does not condemn the woman, the Pope said, because "God 'does not will the death of the sinner, but rather that he be converted and live'." But when He dismisses the woman, Jesus uses "these wonderful words: 'Go, and sin no more'." The Holy Father explains that Jesus, by acting mercifully, had opened "a new path" for the woman, a path that requires from her a commitment not to sin in the future. "It is an invitation that applies to all of us", Pope Francis said. "In this time of Lent, we are called to recognise that we are sinners, and to ask for forgiveness from God". And, he said in conclusion, that forgiveness helps us to begin our own story anew, because "every conversion is directed to a new future, to a new life, a beautiful life, a life free from sin, a generous life".
