1 Kings 3:5, 7-12

A reading from the first book of the Kings You have asked for wisdom.

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this', the Lord said, 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you.'



While recovering at the castle of Loyola, he experienced a religious awakening. He felt the desire to help people understand their own spiritual nature. Over the next year he collected his thoughts on paper for what would evolve into **Spiritual Exercises**, his most important work. The piece took him 20 years to complete. **St Ignatius**, **pray for us**.

ST JOHN VIANNEY - 4 August 2023. Patron of Priests: Was a French Catholic priest who is venerated in the Catholic Church as a saint and as the patron saint of parish priests. He is



often referred to as the "Curé d'Ars" (The parish priest of Ars.), internationally known for his priestly and pastoral work in his parish in Ars, France, because of the radical spiritual transformation of the community and its surroundings. Mt 13:44-52

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

He sells everything he owns and buys the field.

Jesus said to the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field which someone has found; he hides it again, goes off happy, sells everything he owns and buys the field.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet cast into the sea that brings in a haul of all kinds. When it is full, the fishermen haul it ashore; then, sitting down, they collect the good ones in a basket and throw away those that are no use. This is how it will be at the end of time: the angels will appear and separate the wicked from the just to throw them into the blazing furnace where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.

'Have you understood all this?' They said, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Well, then, every scribe who becomes a disciple of the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out from his storeroom things both new and old.'

Breaking Open the Word

FINDING OUR TREASURE

As a young king, Solomon knew that he had much to learn to be the ruler the people of Israel needed him to be. When God invited him to ask for whatever he needed he asked for the gift of discernment between good and evil. Wealth might come and go, but the treasure he needed most of all was the gift of wisdom.

Matthew concludes the parabolic discourse with four parables that emphasise the wisdom that is required to not only recognise what is of lasting value but to hold on to it when we find it. It can be that what is of value is often hidden like the treasure in the field, or needs to be discovered like the pearl, or sorted like the catch that the dragnet brings in. While Jesus spoke of the treasure of the kingdom of God, Matthew has come to see that the pearl of great price is Jesus himself who is the source of our hope and the wisdom we need to live life to the full.

Throughout the eighth chapter of the letter to the Romans, Paul encourages his readers to take heart during the struggles and difficulties that they face as Christians. Our faith itself is a pearl of great price, a gift and treasure that gives us the strength to deal with the struggles and complexities of our lives. God can transform even the darkest moments and our faith helps us to live with hope in the future glory God has prepared for us.

The Hilton Parish Church is dedicated to Our Lady of Mt Carmel, a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order.

Commencing with the 9am Mass, Sunday 16 July, the celebrations continued with a celebratory cutting of the cake by long-time parishioners, including 84-year-old Marian Randall, 84, Portio Curton, 83 and Rose Pearce, 83.

Ms Randall, Ms Curton and Ms Pearce have each spent more than 30 years at Hilton Parish, and the celebration was enjoyed by all with many parishioners networking till after 11am.

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly was celebrated internationally, Sunday 23 July, with Parish Priest Fr Paul Raj emphasised that all grandparents and the elderly were acknowledged during the homily and prayers of the faithful.

Fr Paul continued by highlighting that the elderly parishioners of Hilton have worked hard in making the parish their home.

"For the last 10 years, our parishioners have chosen the motto, 'Hospitality is our Special Care" and as such have extended a designated area for hospitality in front of the church," Fr Paul explained.

"A team of parishioners work together each week to organise and co-ordinate morning tea for all after 9am Mass.

"This works well here in Hilton, especially for elderly parishioners," Fr Paul concluded.

Prior to the celebrations on 16 July, several parishioners committed to nine days of novena, praying for peace, families, youth, victims of violence and abuse, the sick and the elderly.
