


REFLECTION: For some of us who have lived long enough, there is much in our lives to regret, mistakes, sins, times that we have left side down and the constant companion is our own weakness. My great Aunt used to recite a poem for me when I was a child. It was called "It might have been". I found it really sad and when she explained it to me, I found it even sadder. We too can look at our life and wished it had been other than it is. We can be eternally lingering in the land of "It might have been". These areas become what I call "the locked room or the locked rooms plural". Theare are those

places into which I do not give even to myself admittance, yet alone God. I try to pretend that they are not there and when their memories steel upon me, I run away as fast as I can, I don't want to know. I forget that their memories are simply a call from their own loneliness begging me to revisit them, absolve them, understand them and give them peace. Furthermore, I don't understand that they are crying out for the God who can heal them. This is the same God you know who keeps vigil with me as I refuse to own my own life or rather own it as I want it not as it really is. This is the God who desperately wants admittance in our locked rooms, in order to give us the joy of living freely and unimpeded by the perceived blackness of our past. Yet He will not force His way in. He waits and is prepared to sit with us forever in our brokenness and our denial if that is what it takes. We forget that part of the blessedness of Jesus' time on earth was that He transformed our darkness into light. Truly what is frighteningly dark for us is light for Him. That while our locked rooms frightened the lights out of us, they hold no terror for Him. Gethsemane itself was transformed because He was there. If only we know deep within us the truth of His presence, His love vigil with you and me and His excellent track, He would unlock those locked doors, take our courage in our hand, face the pain of memories. Put the kettle on and let Jesus repaint the place, refurnish the room, knock a window in the wall to give us a panoramic view of His own loving landscape and our regard. Smash down another wall and turn it into a lovely sitting room with a welcoming fire and easy chairs where we can sit and enjoy each other's company and have Him tell us the story over and over and over again which is His love for us. There is no end He would do. If only you and I would take the risk of trusting Him enough and letting Him in. Let us not go on living in the regret of the past. Let's not keep saying "It might have been".



Mt 23: 1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

# They do not practise what they preach.

Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi.

'You however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'

# Breaking Open the Word

# CALLED TO SERVE

Leadership has always been a risky business. With leadership comes prestige and the esteem of others and yet these can be dangerous and murky waters. Those involved in leadership often experience being caught in the tension between the respective privileges and responsibilities that accompany their position. Today's readings converge in their concern to reflect on the nature of authority and how it should be exercised.

At the time Malachi wrote, the people of Israel were in dire need of religious reform and the priests were called to account for their role in creating that situation. If the charge could be laid at the feet of the priests in Malachi's time that they did not care for the people, the same could not be said for Paul. While Paul was called to be an apostle, he was also most concerned to offer the gospel without charge. In the ancient world wandering teachers were usually sponsored financially. Paul avoided such ambiguous relationships by not accepting any help from a community till he had established it and was ready to move on to another.

When Jesus sets out to address the disciples and the people about the scribes and Pharisees it probably sounded fairly safe. Anyone can be comfortable when another person is being subjected to scrutiny and criticism! But the second half of the Gospel suddenly changes direction and disciples in every age are given some guiding principles. Firstly, leadership comes from God, secondly, we belong to one family and thirdly, leadership means service.
