REFLECTION: Love demands а response. One of the most amazing things about love is that it demands a response. Imagine a young man who runs up to a beautiful young woman, falls on his knees in front of her and presents her with a dozen roses. He does not need to say anything. It is clear by this symbol that he is professing his love for her, unless he starts pointing to the price



tag in which case he is trying to sell them to her. But if we assume from this moment that this is a statement of love the woman is placed in a very awkward position. She makes a response and in fact any movement she makes at this point will be interpreted as being for her response. Sadly, in the case for the love-sick man anything short of a 'yes' will be taken as a rejection. So the young woman needs to think very carefully about what she says at this moment. This becomes a decisive moment that cannot be put off. For a more convenient time. This is always a case with love. Love always demands a response from us. This is something we need to reflect upon in our relationship with God. We know that the 'Cross' is God's statement of love for us but do you ever stop and think that perhaps Jesus is looking for you and I to give Him an answer as though He is saying 'This is how much I love you. How much I will give you.' Will you make a response, or will you and I leave Him hanging?

WATCHING AND WAITING

The liturgical year begins, Advent dawns, and the readings call us into reflection and renewal of our relationship with God. The prophet Isaiah's plea resounds across the ages, lamenting the current state of affairs. Having already asked God to see how bad things are, he beseeches God "Oh that you would tear the heavens open and come down." Then and now, God's help is needed to turn our lives around.

The psalm invites us to raise our voices in response "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved." Paul writing to the Corinthians offers a thanksgiving to God for the revelation of Jesus Christ and prays with all gratefulness so that they, and we, "will not be without any of the gifts of the Holy Spirit while waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ."

In today's Gospel four imperatives emphatically call upon our hearts: "see" and "be alert" come in rapid succession, then "stay awake" is repeated. This warning to stay awake is echoed twice to the disciples in Gethsemane. The beginning of Mark's Gospel announces, "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ" (v1) and "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news" (v15). The ultimate moment of revelation of Jesus comes with the resurrection and the empty tomb. This is our time to turn our hearts to God, to hear the good news, to wait with gratitude and renew our souls before celebrating anew the birth of Jesus, God among us.
