for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'


Go up on a high mountain,

The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. O Dear LORD, renew my spirit and free my soul. Please, open my heart which You have bathed in the longing of ADVENT.



REFLECTION: At the Seminary, we had two large commercial toasters. We needed them both for breakfast. One toaster unfortunately 'hit the dust' and a new



toaster was promptly acquired. Yes, one new along side one which had seen better days. As a seminarian then, I recall making toast on the new addition, but it didn't quite do the job I was used to. It was probably doing a proper job of making bread look like toast as it ought to. I glanced with a certain nostalgia at the 'dead' toaster and since then I had formed a new partnership. I knew exactly how to set the thing in order to get the toast I liked. Now this is in direct contradiction to the way it should be. I set it so low that in normal way of things I should have ended up with a slice of hot bread, but not for my friend the dud toaster - was perfect. I thought it was a little like with God and us. He knows exactly how He likes things to be and so we expect that He will sensibly chose the most reliable, the newest, the most capable means of getting things done. It is so often that He acts in direct contradiction to this. He choses you and me, He chose the dud toaster. He choses the one that needs to be programmed differently to yield the best there is. It has nothing to do with us at all, after all we are duds. It has everything to do with God, who wants what we can produce and best of all wants us. God will use you today to smile at the total stranger on the bus, to use a courteous word to someone who's rude to you, to walk simply through the street with good will in your heart, to do all manner of things and it wont matter a 'jot' if you get it right or not. You're doing things your way because in the end it's all up to God. As St Paul says in the first letter to the Corinthians, Chapter 1, Verses 27-28, is absolutely correct 'God choses what is weak by human standards.' Let us be proud of our 'dud' toaster verses status. We indeed have been chosen.

# Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

# Breaking Open the Word

# IN THE WILDERNESS

In Australia we experience the desert and wilderness in all its beauty and expanse, yet it can be a lonely, dangerous place. Today we hear a voice crying out in the wilderness in the time of Isaiah and echoed in the Gospel. This voice also cries out to us today, in the wilderness and the desert of our lives. The voice is consolation: "Console, console my people" (Is 40:1). It bellows, "In the wilderness, prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. (Is 40:3). Isaiah's words create an image of the landscape of our life and soul, in need of God.

The Gospel engages this imagery for John the Baptist, a guide in the wilderness who heralds the Messiah. Mark gives name to the voice just as he identified that this writing is "The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God" (1:1). Although the name of Isaiah is invoked, the first quote is from Malachi "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way (1:2 cf. Mal 3:1); then comes the echo from Isaiah 40:3. Here in the wilderness John announces the one who is to come who will baptise with the Holy Spirit (Mark 7-8). This is the announcement of the Messiah, the one longed for. As we hear that voice in our wilderness, we know that Jesus is with us. We can reflect on our attention to his presence and our welcome to him in our souls and lives.
