

Parishioners, please be advised, the Authority will be Auditing our records of Working With Children. We are reminded again that all volunteers and



those in active ministries in the parish must hold a current Working With Children Card. This is mandatory. If you have let your Working With Children Check lapse, please make immediate arrangements to have it renewed so to enable yourself to continue serving the parish community. Forms can be obtained from the local post office or from the parish office. Please remember when filling out the form to use only black ink pen. Again, I wish to add that the Authority has power to impose severe fines and possible imprisonment for non-compliance.

REFLECTION: Little Black Ant. I saw the funniest thing the other day. Our home just like other homes know of a plague of ants from time to time. I went to make a cuppa and I opened the clear plastic sugar container. I saw a single small black ant tide along the white sugar and hide itself

along the side of the plastic container and then become totally motionless. The impression it had made was that if it didn't move, then I would not notice it was there. But you see it couldn't burrow so it was pretty much on top of the sugar anyway. I saw my little friend and I laughed. If ants had any power of reason and how on earth did this little being think that I would not see it. Its black form standing out in sharp contrast to its surrounds. I picked it up with a sugar loaded teaspoon and I put it outside to take its chances with the elements. It occurred to me that we are so often like that ant. We think that God doesn't see us. We sometimes think we are too insignificant for God to pay attention to us. After all who are we? Just average people who go about our lives falling down and getting up again. We don't see ourselves as anything spectacular not in anyway. And yet we are as oblivious to God as my little black friend in the white sugar was to me. There is no escaping His eyes of love. Sometimes you and I do something we are ashamed of, and we hope He doesn't see us. We forget His eye of compassion and seeks us out and wants nothing more than to pick us up and lift us out of our misery. We think perhaps because we don't talk to Him as much as we ought to that He hasn't got used to hearing from us and that now we are off His radar and of course He doesn't see us. We forget that He comes to the clear plastic container of our life, lifts the lid and hopes today that we might just crawl across to Him. there is something else really, if we do let Him into our lives, if we do talk to Him asking Him things, be on familiar terms with Him as He wants us to be then He will become the black ant in our lives, and we will always notice Him even when He is still and seeing Him there at every turn will make all the difference. I wonder when you'll see Him this week. I wonder where He will see you.

He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end." Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

# Breaking Open the Word

# THE ANNUNCIATION

On the eve of Christmas, today's Gospel reminds us of how the birth of Jesus is possible. Luke's narrative describes God sending the Angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee. It is a familiar story to us, yet nothing of it is in our realm of experience.

This event is reported in a series of stories paralleling the annunciation and birth accounts of John the Baptist and Jesus. The narrative will present John as herald of the arrival of Jesus as Messiah when the time of his public ministry arrives, fulfilling God's promise.

Rightly this is an account of God's activity via Gabriel announcing first to Zechariah and then to Mary. Here is a moment bathed in God's grace. God's incarnation will occur in a natural human manner, born of a woman. Yet take a focus on Mary and imagine again the appearance of an angel. No surprise that she might be perplexed (Luke 1:29). Yet Mary responds, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." (v. 38).

Mary also hears of her cousin Elisabeth's fortunate conception and sets off to see her. Their meeting, the centrepoint of the double annunciations and births, reveals these two women in embrace, together they usher in the birth of the Son of God. Today, the focus is on Mary's embrace of her mission but she is part of a larger story, God's story. Mary is a courageous woman who in the face of an impossible challenge steps forward in faith.
