REFLECTION: Epiphany. St Francis of Assisi extols the many virtues of "Brother Fire". "All the praise be yours my God through Brother Fire you brighten the night. How beautiful he is. How cheerful. Full pr power and strength." Jesus identifies himself as the light of the world and the light of life for those who follow Him. He reminds the disciples of this after the sermon on the mount. "You are the light of the world." Let your light before others." He speaks of Fire's power when he says, "I came to bring fire to the earth and how I wish it were already blazing." The disciples also speak of this power too at Emmaus. "Were not our hearts burning within us while He was talking to us along the road." Many mystics have spoken of this living lame of love of God "burning within us." Interestingly a flame loses nothing of itself when it lights another flame. This is a beautiful analogy for love. The more we love the

more love is created – nothing is taken away. The fourteenth German mystic, Meister Eckhart referred to God as "the spark of the soul". We know this spark as we pray and our capacity for love is enhanced. We see this when our circle of those we love widens and when our love responses in daily life deepens. We can come to know this profound love in nature as a deep calm and stillness within us. Or even a feeling of warmth within the centre of one's chest. It is the response we might have when we circus to the aw of a vast scene stretched before us. The night sky or even the wonder of the tiny colourful sea creatures or even the vastness of golden white ears of wheat swaying in the paddocks in our wheatbelt. We sense the living flame of light and love in creation and in ourselves. As st Francis says, "we then know its beauty and cheerfulness." The French Jesuit, palaeontologist, theologian, philosopher Pierre Teihard de Chardin describes so well as he said "The day will come when after we have mastered the winds, the waves, the tides, and gravity. We shall harness for God's energies of love. Then for a second time in the history of the world humankind will have discovered fire." As we celebrate the occasion of the revelation of the Christ Child as a gift to the three Gentile wisemen, may the fire of love for Him always be kindles in our hearts.

wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea', they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

- And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,
- you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah,
- for out of you will come a leader

who will shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

"YOUR LIGHT HAS COME"

Wait! Don't pack up your Christmas tree and crib just yet! Today's feast is the celebration of the coming of the magi with their gifts. They come, as we hear in our Gospel today, because they "observed his star at its rising" (Matt 2:2). Their seeking of the child who has been born the king of the Jews takes us as hearers on the journey to see the revelation, the epiphany, of Jesus as the Messiah.

Following the star, the magi will be brought to a house where, on entering, "they saw the child with Mary his mother" (v.11). Coming from the East they are Gentiles who recognise who Jesus is and fall to their knees and pay him homage.

From the outset of Matthew's Gospel in the unfolding of the genealogy it is clear that "Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham" (1:1) is enfolded in the covenant of God with Abraham where God makes him the ancestor of a multitude of nations (Gen 17:4-6). This Gospel will conclude with the sending out of the eleven disciples to "make disciples of all nations" (Matt 28:19). The first worshippers of the Lord bring out their gifts of treasure. Through this child the treasures of the kingdom of heaven will be revealed. What can it mean to us to realise "your light has come" and to recognise and worship our Lord among us? How do we encounter the treasure of the kingdom of heaven in our lives today?
