Lev 13: 1-2, 44-46

A reading from the book of Leviticus.

As long as he is unclean, he must live alone, outside the camp.

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

**REFLECTION:** The Energy of Love. You may have heard of Pierre Teilhard De Chardin, born in France on 1 May 1881. He died 10 April 1955. He was a Jesuit priest, philosopher, scientist and paleontologist, theologian. He was silenced by the Church for somewhat left field views of God and mankind. and he completely accepted this with the result that today the Church had reclaimed and recognized him for the same that he really said. Teilhard said and wrote some marvellous things such as the translation in the book, "Toward the Future". He wrote, "The day will come when after harnessing space. the winds. the tides gravitation, we shall harness for God the energies of love and on that day for the second time in the history of the world man would have discovered fire". This statement is worth while thinking about. It offers much encouragement because despite the ill

winds that blow across our troubled world today, I believe the energies of love are indeed being harnessed. Perhaps more so because there seems to be so little love, we don't know exactly what it means to harness space, winds, tides, gravitation though the human race is certainly working hard on it. And there are enough examples where we have and have not succeeded yet. We don't have to want mankind to catch up with these things. On the Cross Jesus harnessed for God the energies of love and it brought about our salvation and entrance to get into the eternal kingdom and give us a place that no one, nothing can take away from us. No one can tell us, not even ourselves that we don't belong to God or that the goodness is somehow not for us. It does not matter what we have done, the right is ours and it was won by Jesus when at a cost He harnessed the forces of love and indeed "fire" fell upon the earth. Furthermore, today we can join many others and begin to harness the energies of love for God now, right where we are. It is already happening as you good people are doing so much. Check out the daily news, well yes, many terrible things are happening certainly but equally more things are happening too, GOOD things. When the attack in Manchester happened, it's told that two hundred men were at the entrance. One was begging and one was asleep. When the blast happened, one grabbed as many souvenir tee shirts as he could and started to stem the bleeding of some of the victims. The other cradled the terrified people in his arms. They harnessed the energies of love and

fire; it was discovered anew. May you know that kind of "fire" this week.

RESIDENCY IN THE PRESBYTERY. **UPDATE:** Parishioners, I wish to inform those projects such as Maintenance to the Presbytery, where the expenditure exceeds \$50,000 requires submission to and approval by the Archbishop. An application for expenditure from the Parish involves provision of a brief which includes two three builders' auotes. suppliers tradespersons or showing of the source of finance to meet the costing and that the Parish is capable to meet the cost or the debt. Because of the urgency of the matter and to comply to Safeguarding guidelines, the Archbishop's Office granted permission for the project. In lieu of the Parish calling for builder tenders etc. the church Authority offered the assistance for its own Property / Maintenance Office in so much as provide costings. The Property Office draws from their own panel of trades persons to undertake the extensive maintenance of church property. These costings were closely scrutinised by the attendees at the Parish Council meeting. The costings were found to be "on par" to that which would be on the market. It was unanimously passed that the Parish accept the quote. The decision was conveyed to the Church Office and approval was granted. Work is scheduled to begin in the pursing weeks. So please take care and keep a distance to the grounds around the church and presbytery. In the interim the Priest and Parish Secretary will be relocated to the Parish Meeting Room. 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#### GOSPEL

Mk 1: 40-45

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

## The leprosy left him and he was cured.

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

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# Breaking Open the Word

#### BE AS CHRIST

Today's Gospel brings our focus again to Jesus' healing through a person identified only as "a leper". This person is described without gender (although masculine pronouns follow), without ethnicity, family name, geography or any human connection. The title "a leper" encapsulates the stigma of separation, being unclean and having to live apart (see Lev. 13, first reading). We read that "a leper" came to Jesus pleading on his knees, "If you want to you can make me clean" (v. 40). This phrase indicates that "a leper" recognises Jesus' power and authority. Moved with the deepest gutwrenching compassion, Jesus reaches out his hand and touches him. Simultaneously with his touch, Jesus says "I do choose. Be made clean" (v. 41). Jesus' touch is redeeming in itself. Jesus touches the untouchable. Though warned not to say anything and show himself to the priest, the person "went out and began to proclaim freely and spread the word" (v. 45). We witness "a leper" becoming a proclaimer of the Good News. In our world today there are people with titles like "a leper", as we have "homeless" or "refugee" among us bereft of identity and dignity, untouchable. How can we "touch" like Jesus?

Paul's words to the Corinthians invite us to take him as the model as he takes Christ. This invitation together with the healing of one on the margins calls us to be as Christ, open to all and to be agents of healing wounds and separation.
