This is the only name by which we can be saved.



## REFLECTION: 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday Easter – Praying for Others:

A dear friend asked me to pray for him recently. I was moved by the request and of course was very happy to do it. And because as I said he is a dear friend I took it seriously very indeed. Throughout the day I saw myself as standing beside him. I saw myself hanging onto his hand. I myself willing, saw as moving all the confidence that I have in God's power and love into him. I saw myself moving all my deep conviction that God has everything in hand, he will never let us down. I saw myself moving that into his

heart. I saw myself as shoring up the foundation of his faith and it suddenly hit me, when you and I are asked to pray for somebody else, when you and I pray for somebody else that is what we are truly doing. We are not putting God in a "Full Nelson" and beating him to the ground to make that he something He was going to do anyway because of his great love. We don't pray for somebody else in order to remind God what he has forgotten. We don't pray to God for somebody else so that God will get moved out of his embrasure and see the problem in front of Him! No, no, no, no. We pray for somebody else knowing that the grace to sure up the foundations of the other person is there. What a gift it is to be able to hold the hand of somebody else, to sure up foundations of another's faith, to be asked to pray for them.

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GOSPEL

In 10: 11-18

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

The good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep. Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd:

the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father: and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold. and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

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# Breaking Open the Word

### FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

One of the recurring themes in Acts is that of the apostles and disciples being 'filled with the Holy Spirit' which, in turn, finds expression in the boldness of their speech. As Peter addresses the rulers and elders, we observe his boldness in answering their query concerning the healing of a disabled person. Peter qualifies that he does this 'in the name of Jesus Christ the crucified one whom God raised.' He acknowledges that his power and authority come from God through Jesus Christ. He acts in the name of Jesus Christ; he heals as he did. His actions, and not just his words, are testament and witness to the one whom God raised.

The Gospel of John speaks of Jesus as the good shepherd, 'the one who lays his life down for his sheep.' This image of Jesus contrasts with that of the shepherds mentioned in the Old Testament who were bad leaders who led the people of Israel astray. It also interacts with New Testament writings that warn of false shepherds. Jesus, the good shepherd, can be trusted. He is the Son of God and not a hired hand. The focus of the passage is on Jesus as the one who laid down his life freely. In John's account, we hear that Jesus has the power to take up his life again. This is possible, Jesus says, as it is 'the command I have been given by my Father' and it offers strong assurance of God's power in Jesus, of his complete trust in the love of God and his own love for his sheep.
