FIRST READING

Acts 2: 1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.


Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. SECOND READING

Gal 5: 16-25

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians

The fruit of the Spirit.

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course.

REFLECTION: Be the 'Amen': Some years ago, I had the happiness of speaking with an elderly sister as she was then. She had taken under her wing a woman Alice by name who was shall we say a little intellectually disabled. This woman wanted to know more about God. She wanted to know how she could serve God better. Anyway, Reverend Sister, the elderly nun put her through her paces week, after week after week seemingly to no avail. Then one day she said to the woman, "Alice do you know any prayers?" And Alice looked her straight in the eye and said to her: Oh yes Sister. I know the "Amen" prayer. Again, I was much younger when I heard this. I was amused. "Oh yes sister I know the 'Amen", but I don't think its amusing anymore. Now I know with what great depth there was in the answer "I know the Amen". Amen as you know means "So be it". When we hear something in prayer, and we say "Amen" we mean that we agree with everything that has been said. How many times do you and I say Amen when we are in Church or when we pray and don't give it a second thought. And yet if the only prayer we ever prayed was Amen that would be wonderful! There is depth, there is agreement with the will of God. It is the willingness to let God be God in our lives no matter what happens. It speaks of a trust that no matter how things look it shall be well and we know it! (Julian of Norwich) When we say Amen we are putting our hands into the hand of God and expressing a willingness to let Him take us wherever He wants to. We ae telling Him we know that He is the supreme Creator and ruler of all things. Therein I say to you therein is our happiness, our contentment, and our peace. He is God not me and in saying Amen I am saying "I know it!" Let us make it a practice this week not only to pay attention to the "Amen" but also to say and BE the AMEN.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The Spirit of truth will guide you into all the truth. Jesus said to his disciples:

'When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness.

And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset. I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'

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Breaking Open the Word

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

Today's first reading begins with the words: 'When the day of Pentecost had come, the apostles were all together in one place.' (Acts 2:1). Earlier in 1:13-14 we learn that with them 'were certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers'. They were constantly devoting themselves to prayer (v. 14). It is in this context of a community in prayer that there arose the sound of a powerful wind and something like tongues of fire came to rest on them as they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Immediately they were changed, boldly proclaiming the good news in language understandable to all. Our reading finishes with the list of places people had come from. A very pertinent question is asked in the verse following today's reading: (v. 12) 'What does this mean?' It is a question as much for us as for them.

Paul's Letter to the Galatians entreats us to live lives 'directed by the Spirit' – lives in which the fruits of the Spirit unfold and blossom, the fruits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness and goodness.

John's Gospel names the Spirit 'the Advocate' and 'Spirit of Truth' who issues from God. Believers in the risen Christ are not alone. The Advocate who witnesses to the truth of Jesus Christ, will lead believers to the complete truth: 'And you too will be witnesses'. From then till now believers are filled with the Holy Spirit and are to be witnesses to the truth of Jesus and the Good News. Our lives will be recognisable by the fruits of the Spirit.
